

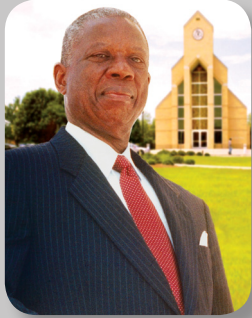

"It's Time Out for Foolishness"

Dr. Brooks delivers an empowering message about striving for excellence and the importance of education

An attentive and thoroughly entertained audience received a dose of wisdom and encouragement during this week's assembly sponsored by the Division of Education in collaboration with the Student-South Carolina Education Association.

The speaker of this year's "empowering message" in observance of American Education Week was Dr. Allie E. Brooks, Jr., interim superintendent of Florence County School District One. Prior to his current appointment, Dr. Brooks worked for 35 years in Florence area public schools as the assistant principal at West Florence High School from 1971 to 1974, and principal of Wilson High School from 1974 to 2005.

As commented by President Richardson, the message was one that he hoped students would "remember and put into practice." In his opening remarks Dr. Brooks said, "I want to have a serious talk with the students." "I don't know a business that wants to hire people of mediocrity. They want to hire young ladies who behave like ladies and they want to hire young men who dress and behave like young men." He went on to say, "We need to understand that a part of being a good student, is being a good person. The business of education is serious!"

He continued to urge students to understand and apply the basic principles of excellence to their daily pursuit of education. Simply stated, "It's time out for foolishness," he proclaimed. As he concluded, he told students, "We need people who will move from ordinary to distinction. Excellence is for anyone who wants it!"

The **Annual Fall Harvest Worship Service and Rally** will take place tomorrow at 10:30 a.m. in the college's Garrick-Boykin Human Development Center. The guest preacher will be the Reverend Dr. Ronald Leon Bobo, Sr.

Dr. Bobo, the Senior Pastor of the West Side Missionary Baptist Church in St. Louis, MO since June 1, 1986, is the proud son of the late Deacon Wallace and the late Deaconess Willie Mae Bobo. Having accepted Jesus Christ at seven years old, he has been active and has served in various areas of the church including Choir Director, Bible Study Teacher, Bible College Instructor, Evangelist and local Pastor.

Dr. Bobo was educated in the school system of his native Detroit, MI. He earned the Bachelor of Science degree in Music Education from the Oakland University, Rochester, MI and the Master of Divinity and the Doctor of Ministry degrees from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, KY.

Dr. Bobo served as the Assistant Pastor at Bates Memorial Missionary Baptist Church (1978-1981), Louisville, KY before being elected its Pastor in 1982. In 1986, he was called to serve West Side Missionary Baptist Church. Under his current pastoral leadership, Westside Missionary Baptist Church has expanded its ministry and in 1997 obtained ownership of a former Target Department Store in North St. Louis County. Thus, West Side has become "one unified church in two locations." The congregation entered Phase 1 of the renovated facility in May of 2004.

Dr. Bobo is a sought after guest preacher and/or teacher for various conventions, congresses, retreats, revivals and conferences. He is a Trustee for the Morehouse School of Religion, Atlanta, GA.

Dr. Bobo is married to the former Darlean Anita Daniels of Detroit, MI. They are the parents of three sons and have five grandchildren: Tierra Yasmine, Trevon Ronald, Charles, Jr., Tara Ashlynn and Chase Edward.

In addition to the worship service message, attendees will hear music from the Morris College Chorale and the Morris College Gospel Choir.
