

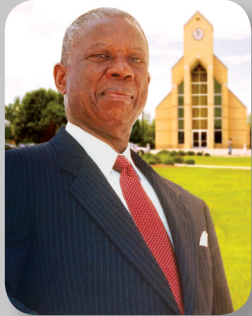

Grants Outline Strategy for Success

Husband and wife team, Anthony Grant and Helen Nelson Grant, provided a clear cut strategy to navigating the "Gateway to Greatness" in their address at Thursday's Business Week Assembly. "Gateway to Greatness" is the theme for Business Week.

Speaking from more than 26 years of experience in marriage and business, the Grants advised that setting priorities in the correct order is the key to navigating success. They explained that one must prioritize God, family, school and job in that order. Tony Grant, as he is affectionately called, said, "Prayer is also important. I know that I can do all things through Christ Jesus who strengthens me."

In addition to setting priorities, the Grants said preparation and flexibility are essential elements.

Nelson Grant said, "Prepare, visualize yourself in the position you desire." She said this includes physically visiting the environment where the opportunity exists and learning all that you can about that position.

Flexibility as the Grants described it is a willingness

to navigate success by accepting positions that may not be ideal but have some component of the dream job. Tony Grant shared that he began his career with Bank of America as a trainee, eventually rising to huge levels of responsibility and working with the CEO of the company. The Grants agree that flexibility also involves a willingness to let the priorities guide your decision making.

Lastly, they cautioned that one must be mindful of reputation. This means guarding the image portrayed in social media as well as the image perceived by one's appearance. Tony Grant stated, "Others will judge you by what they see. One must dress for success. Be mindful of the environment you aspire to work in and present yourself as you want to be perceived."

Dean Staggers gave closing remarks in President Richardson's absence. Staggers applauded the Grants for bringing the truth. He also commended Dr. Richard Smith and the Division of Business Administration for their efforts and activities for Business Week.

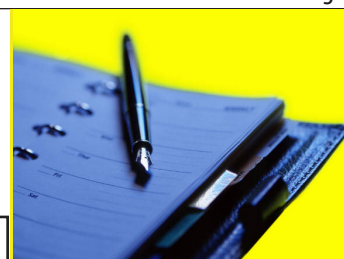

History of American Education Week

Distressed that 25 percent of the country's World War I draftees were illiterate and nine percent were physically unfit, representatives of the NEA and the American Legion met in 1919 to seek ways to generate public support for education.

Both of the organizations adopted resolutions to support a national effort to raise public awareness of the importance of education. In 1921, the NEA Representative Assembly in Des Moines, Iowa, called for a week each year to highlight education. The NEA called for: "An educational week ... observed in all communities annually for the purpose of informing the public of the accomplishments and needs of the public schools and to secure the cooperation and support of the public in meeting those needs."

The first observance of American Education Week occurred December 4-10, 1921. A year later, what was then known as the U.S. Office of Education joined the effort as a co-sponsor, and the PTA followed in 1938.

Current co-sponsors are the U.S. Department of Education, the National PTA, the American Legion, the American Association of School Administrators, the National School Boards Association, the American Federation of Teachers, the American School Counselor Association, the Council of Chief State School Officers, the National School Public Relations Association, the National Association of State Boards of Education, the National Association of Elementary School Principals, and the National Association of Secondary School Principals.

This year is the 90th Anniversary for American Education Week. Morris College is proud to celebrate National American Education Week. Join us for the activities.
