

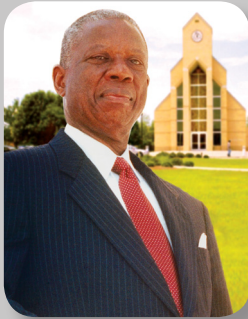

Greek-letter Organizations Honor Founders

This week was a time for reflecting back and honoring the founders of three Greek-letter organizations, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. and Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. All three organizations were founded on the campus of Howard University in Washington, D.C.

The celebration of the founders began on Tuesday evening, January 17, 2012 with a joint program held by the Pi Theta Chapter of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. and the Iota Zeta Chapter of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc. Tuesday's program brought words of wisdom from Giana Gardner, the South Carolina State Director of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. She advised, "The trinity of strength, courage, and wisdom" are needed to combat the disparities and problems of today. She said the greatest of these is wisdom.

Gardner encouraged the campus community to courageously address national issues of injustice, domestic violence and mental illness.

On Thursday morning, Anita Blassingame, Morris College alumna and member of the Sumter graduate chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., imparted pearls of wisdom to the campus community as she addressed Nu Gamma Chapter's theme, "Becoming Global Leaders through Timeless Service," during the sorority's founders' day program.

Blassingame spoke on the "Five known secrets of leadership: Submission, Sincerity, Sacrifice, Supplication, and Strategy." She shared that sacrifice means a willingness to exhibit your leadership qualities. "As students, you do not have to wait until you enter the professional world. You can do that right now, right here at Morris College." She advised, "It is never too late to be who you were meant to be. Expect nothing but the best, especially from yourself."

Dr. Richardson gave closing remarks at both programs. On Tuesday evening, he complimented Ms. Gardner on "Giving a dynamic and meaningful address that was worthy of being delivered anywhere." He also expressed his appreciation to the Zetas and the Sigmas for being the first Greek-letter organizations to come to Morris College.

Black History Month Cinema

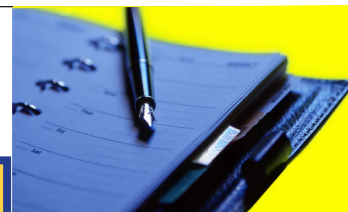
