

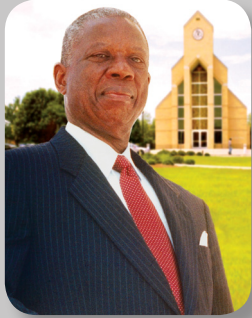

President Richardson and SGA President Challenge Students to be Leaders

The Student Government Association's Assembly on Thursday, September 15, 2011, challenged all classes to step up to their role and responsibility in leading. Mr. Kenard Jones, president of SGA, gave the address. He advised the freshmen class to, "Make your first impression a positive one." Reminding students that they should respect faculty and administration, he stated, You want to get where they are and possess bachelors, masters, and or doctorate degrees."

To sophomores and junior he charged, "Be a role model. Assist in molding the freshmen class. Promote a high grade point average. Get involved with campus clubs and organizations. I challenge you to assist." To the senior class he cautioned, "As student leaders our job is not done until we walk across the stage and receive our degree." He also informed seniors that they have a dual role as leaders, explaining that in addition to mentoring underclassmen they must help one another to make it to graduation day.

Jones concluded his address by directing students to remember the quote, "I am the foundation for success and I have to participate to graduate." Jones is a senior business administration major from Greenville, SC.

Dr. Richardson's closing remarks were a strong parallel to Jones' address, stating to the student body, "A good leader is always thinking of others. A good leader works for the welfare of the entire institution." He also cautioned students, "Do not get caught crying or napping when graduation day comes. Do your work and be ready for graduation day."

The Morris College Gospel Choir's opening selection for the assembly, "What if God is not Happy", set the stage for the speaker's remarks, providing an interesting backdrop to a strong message about leadership and helping one another.

SGA President Kenard Jones Reflects on 9/11/2001

On the 10th Anniversary of 9/11, Sunday, September 11, 2011, Mr. Kenard Jones, SGA President, shared his personal reflections of September 11, 2001, at a memorial service held at 6 p.m. in the O. R. Reuben Chapel. Upon hearing of the horror, he spoke of the gripping concern that he and so many experienced after having difficulty reaching close relatives who resided in close proximity to the tragedies. Fortunately, his fears were relieved when his phone calls to sisters were returned. Jones described his most striking memory of 9/11 as, "the prayers to God and the unification of all races that quickly came about after that day." He encouraged all citizens to stay united.

President Richardson commended those who came out to the memorial service, stating, "This is a part of our history that we need to care about and be concerned about. We need to care about one another. We need a heightened sense of understanding of all cultures around the world. This begins in our homes, our places of worship, and our schools and colleges." The service concluded with the lighting of 10 candles in memory of the lives lost on each of the planes, the Twin Towers, the Pentagon, the first responders, private citizens, the military, and the innocent bystanders.

** Things Students Need To Know **

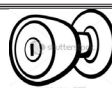
