



Morris College fully understands that success is no accident. That is why we do all we can to ensure that students have an opportunity to succeed. Even the college's mission statement was amended to further reflect our ongoing quest of "preparing students for successful careers and services." It reads: "Morris College is an accredited, four-year, coeducational, residential, liberal arts and career-focused institution awarding baccalaureate degrees in the arts and sciences and in career-based professional fields."

Various expansions to the campus support our efforts to improve the quality of many of the college's current programs and facilities. The completed Forensic Center will greatly benefit our students majoring in Criminal Justice. The current two-story additions to the Wilson-Booker Science Building will enhance instruction for our Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) programs. The following are awaiting construction: a new student health and wellness center which will benefit students studying in the health sciences and recreation administration programs, a new three-story, twin towers residence hall which will alleviate those instances where students are sometimes housed three to a room; and a new administration building.

These new facilities and expansion projects are all part of the college's aim to offer students more and will strengthen our position as an academic center of higher learning. Also, a new physical maintenance plant is completed and houses the maintenance staff and supplies. Its vehicular bay will provide shelter for the buses used to transport students to various events. Other improvements to the college include the creation of a retention pond, the paving and upgrade of remaining gravel parking lots, and the continued improvement to the college's infrastructure.

We realize, of course, that bricks and mortar are not all that are needed to ensure a quality program. On September 19-21, 2011, an on-site review committee for the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission of Colleges (SACS) visited the campus as part of the college's ten-year reaffirmation of accreditation. We will inform our constituents of the accrediting agency's official notification when it is received. Additional programs that have achieved specialized accreditation are Business Administration and Organizational Management. Both are accredited by the Association of Collegiate Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP). The college's Teacher Education Program has successfully met the rigorous standards set forth by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and remains nationally accredited. The program's accreditation was also reaffirmed by the South Carolina State Department of Education. The next NCATE visit is scheduled for 2017.

Building upon a strong foundation laid by our founders, the college has gone far beyond its original mission of training preachers and teachers for the pulpits and schools of the state and nation. Today, hundreds of our graduates have added to the ranks of professionals and business and military persons. Because of the many positive and exciting things the college is doing to ensure an institution that is career-focused and career-based, we urge your generous support of this year's Fall Harvest Rally. This rally gives all of us the opportunity to show others how much we value and appreciate what Morris College is doing. It will be held on Saturday, November 19, 2011 at 10:30 A. M. in the Garrick-Boykin Human Development Center.

Thank you for investing in us. Your resources help maximize our efforts to continue developing students' potential and capabilities. Working together, the caliber of academic programs will be improved and "preparing students for successful careers and services" will be our mission.





FORENSIC CENTER OPENS at Morris with ceremony

Morris College students majoring in criminal justice now have a leg up on learning how to analyze DNA, check fingerprints and run ballistics tests thanks to a new center opened on campus Tuesday.

It was an occasion for faculty, community leaders, local government officials and city and county law enforcement personnel to see a facility that will expand educational opportunities and job skills in the Sumter area.

Think of it as CSI: Sumter, said the facility's new director.

After about three years of planning and a year of construction, the Morris College Criminal Justice Forensic Center opened Monday during a ceremonial ribbon cutting. The \$1.6 million facility will act as a supplement to criminal justice majors by helping them hone their skills in DNA analysis, ballistics, latent prints and other forensic techniques.

Before now, aspiring law enforcers had to either learn those skills either on the job or outside of Sumter. The new forensic center will change that, allowing students to get one to two years of forensic analysis experience before going into the field of law enforcement.

"That on-the-job training is important, but you always have to have a foundation, and this is where they get that foundation of understanding and to learn why they do what they do," said forensic center Director Carlotta Stackhouse, a 25-year veteran of the State Law Enforcement Division. "Local law enforcement will have a ready-made trained staff, and also the facility is open for their use. Even though they do have their own forensic lab, we have some of the technology they don't have, and we can share knowledge bases."

Stackhouse, who retired from SLED about a year and a half ago, was a major who worked as assistant lab director. She also received a master's degree in chemistry from Furman University.

Having the ability to keep students in the area to learn these techniques could benefit local law enforcement agencies, said Stackhouse.

"After they graduate from college, they would have to be hired into

a law enforcement agency, and from there they would have to be trained. They either have to go to classes sponsored by the DEA (Drug Enforcement Administration) or FBI to learn those techniques. The advantage here is you have that training on site," she said.

There are about 100 criminal justice majors at Morris College, according to Stackhouse, and many of them will be utilizing the facility's resources before they graduate in spring 2012. Senior Elon McBride is one those students.

"I've always had a love for law enforcement, I loved 'CSI' and stuff like that. I've always wanted to be a part of it," she said. "I'm ecstatic to have something like this at our disposal. It'll be great to be able to do so many of these things hands on."


Having improved technology on hand and the potential for increased manpower are aspects of the facility Sumter Police Department Deputy Chief Russell Roark and Sumter County Sheriff Anthony Dennis said they're excited about.

"There are high expectations in law enforcement now, particularly given all the TV shows and the assumptions that we'll have all the DNA evidence back before the end of the hour ... this better helps us pool our resources and have a potential pool of candidates we may be able to reach out to in the future," said Roark.

Dennis said he is excited about the prospect of dipping into a pool of well-trained criminal justice majors, but was also happy to keep much of the investigative process local.

"It certainly enhances what we do here through our local law enforcement," said Dennis. "Now we don't have that turn around or that waiting time we would have with sending everything to a state lab. We can have that facility here locally, and that in turn will help speed up our judicial process."

UPDATE: Morris College Building Projects

(Clement Contracting) August 2011

Work was completed on the new 10,500 square foot physical plant which includes four offices, a break room, file storage, general storage areas, a wood working shop, HVAC repair shop, lawn maintenance area and a four bay garage for buses and golf carts. A certificate of occupancy was issued in August 2011. The Solomon Jackson Sr., William McKinley Bowman Sr., Raymond Carolina Physical Plant was funded from the generous \$10 million dollar gift from Solomon Jackson, Jr. The physical plant bears the name of Mr. Jackson's late father and two departed ministers whom Jackson greatly admired.

Storm Water Management Project/Retention Pond (CNA Construction and Pioneer Landscaping) March 2011

The storm water management project includes a new retention pond, lighted asphalt walking path, irrigation system, landscaping and a stormwater system to handle run-off for the campus. This project was essential for the successful development of future projects. As part of this project, West College Street was re-graded and paved in June 2011.



Wilson - Booker Science Building Addition (Harrington Construction Company, Inc.)

Construction is underway for the 8,320 square feet two story addition to the existing Wilson- Booker Science Building and consists of a seminar room, four new offices, two classrooms, two science labs, two research labs, and supporting storage and preparation areas. The project will include minor modifications to a first floor classroom and a second floor science lab.



Camp Julia A. Starks/Dunbar-Gandy Retreat was held during the last week of June on the Morris College campus. Sponsored by the Woman's Baptist Education and Missionary Convention of South Carolina, the 138 campers ranged from ages 6 to 14. An array of activities, fun, and instructions focused on leadership, character development, and bible study. Dr. Claudette C. Cureton is the president.

The Baptist Brotherhood Educational and Missionary Convention of South Carolina held its annual Retreat and Bible Bee in July on the Morris College campus. In addition to a bible bee competition, participants were presented with workshops that focused on mentoring, bullying, leadership, and character development, as well. Approximately 40 to 50 young males were in attendance. Deacon Leroy Martin is president.

The 2011 Summer Component of the Morris College Upward Bound Program commenced on June 8th with a Parent Orientation and Information Session in the Neal-Jones Auditorium.

Forty (40) students from seven (7) target schools, Sumter High, Lakewood High, Crestwood High, East Clarendon, Lee Central, Manning High, Scotts Branch High, in three surrounding counties made up the enrollment of the 2011 Summer Component.

As required by the Department of Education, students were exposed to a variety of academic, cultural and college tour experiences.

The Summer Component, unlike the Tutorial Enrichment

Component, is designed to give students an infusion of subject matter exposure in the basics, Mathematics, Reading, Social Studies, Spanish, Science, Language Arts over a six-week period of time on the college campus.

Students also are given help in assuring success with the state mandated test, HSAP (High School Assessment Program) that they must pass before receiving a high school diploma.

During the 2011 Summer Component, Upward Bound students got a chance to participate in various workshops based on the adopted program theme, "Building a Better You". Topics ranged from resume writing, proper manners, biographical sketches of very important Americans who helped to shape the country, cultural awareness issues, how to get a passport to a talent show where students were able to expose their talents in singing, dance, fashion and impersonations of famous entertainers.

One of the most important components of the summer program is the opportunity afforded Upward Bound students to live in resident halls and having the opportunity of taking advantage of all the facilities on campus that are available to regular college students. This valuable opportunity gives students an edge that will pay great dividends when it is time for them to enroll in a college of their choice.

The 2011 Summer Component ended with a college tour in the Charlotte, North Carolina area and a recreational trip to the Carowinds theme park.



SABB DIRECTS STUDENTS TO ACHIEVE MORE

Attorney Ronnie Alan Sabb delivered a moving address at the Honors Day Convocation on Thursday morning. His words motivated students to go beyond where they are to where they need to go.

He informed students that despite the fact that many may discourage achievement and “snicker” at their efforts to strive for success, “achievement is still significant. It is the core of all those things that represent progress, not only here and nationally but in the world.”

Second, Sabb said, “Be willing to accept criticism with some level of warmth. Criticism is a healthy thing if it challenges you.” He did caution them to have a good filtering system for criticism. “Know what to accept and know what to discard.”

As he continued, Sabb confessed that he was moving away from his notes to share what was on his heart. Wanting to clearly convey that challenges will be on the road to opportunity, he shared personal obstacles he faced on the way to acquiring a college degree and later obstacles that arose after graduation, as well as those encountered at law school. He noted these “stumbling blocks are stepping stones. Do not let them hinder you. Know who you are and whose you are.” Sabb advised students to make tough choices and be willing to listen and engage with those who are older and more experienced. “Allow your territory to be enlarged”. He enlightened them that it is ok to accept help but “have the fortitude to move beyond to a position where you can be of help to someone else.”

He also challenged students to move from thinking about the short term to preparing for the long term; to develop a plan for the years to come. He encouraged them to do as he did when the challenges came. He said he had a God-conversation. “If God does not say yes to your request, he will say yes to something better for you.”

To all students, those with honors and those who have yet to achieve honors he instructed, “Be willing to challenge yourselves. Do not let the fear of failure stop you from going beyond.”







Jessica Morgan & College Professor, Dr. Irene Singletary

JESSICA MORGAN, STUDENT: I have always known that I wanted to be a teacher, but it wasn't until I met Dr. Irene Reed Singletary at Morris College that I realized exactly what kind of teacher I wanted to become. I knew Dr. Singletary for three years, during which she taught me two classes: Methods for Teaching English in a Secondary Classroom and Methods and Materials for Teaching in a Secondary Classroom. Her classes were anything but ordinary. Instead of simply lecturing to the students for an hour, she would review textbooks with us, page by page and then turn and say to us, "Now you do it." She not only wanted us to learn the methods of teaching, but she wanted us to understand the rationale behind each method and exactly how and why they were effective.

Everything about Dr. Singletary inspired me personally and she became a blueprint for the model teacher I hoped one day to become. She was so compassionate and wanted every student in the class to succeed. Dr. Singletary had this magical way of making every person in the room feel special while still giving equal time to each of her students. Her teaching style was so exceptional because she didn't care how much time she had to spend on any one subject, she would stay put until every student understood. Amazingly, she asked that we let her know if there was anything we felt she could do to improve her own teaching.

Even after I graduated college, Dr. Singletary proved to be (and still proves to be) a guiding light in my life. After college, I had to take the Praxis 2 examination (a teacher certification exam), and the first time I took it, I didn't pass. Failing that test made me question my lifelong dream of becoming a teacher. I felt defeated, so I contacted Dr. Singletary and she reminded me that in chasing a dream, there would be pitfalls, but that I should never give up and that I could accomplish anything. She encouraged me to take the test again, even helped me prepare, and has continued to be a mentor throughout my teaching career.

If I had to name the most valuable thing Dr. Singletary has taught me, it would be to always believe in yourself and that you can do anything you set your mind to. Anything is possible when you pursue your dreams and it doesn't hurt to have someone in your corner, like Dr. Singletary.

DR. IRENE SINGLETARY, TEACHER: I was Jessica Morgan's teacher for only one semester, during which I taught her two courses, but I soon came to view her as one of my many children at Morris College. When I first met Jessica, she came across as very intelligent, opinionated, and vocal with a quick temper. After we got to know each other on a more personal level, we began spending more time together and I could see that she was also a responsible, dependable and caring young lady.

At the end of our semester together, Jessica wrote a composition explaining how she benefitted from the class and in it, she said that after taking my classes, she had learned to look at life in a completely different way. That was when I first realized what an impact I had made on her. I am so humbled that she believes that I touched her life in such a special way. I consider her one of my children, as I do all of my students, who, in return fondly refer to me as, "Momma."

My teaching career is the most important part of my life. It satiates a hunger within me to make a difference in the lives of young people. It allows me to be of service to others and to experience success every time they do. Really, to me what I gain from teaching seems selfish, for what I get from my students far exceeds what they believe they may get from me. I am exhilarated each time I hear about their successes, and I share their pain when they experience hardships. Once I have taught students, I am forever connected to them. I still communicate with some of my students from the very first group I taught in 1970. They become a part of my life. Teaching is not just facilitating the content of a subject. It is impacting life and inspiring character.


I believe that I was able to have an impact on young people's lives because I sincerely love and care about them. I do not try to gain their friendship, just their respect, which is really easy for me, because I try to present myself with honesty and integrity. When I learn that they have done something inappropriate, I speak with them about it and listen when they need to share. When they do well, I celebrate their successes as well.

If I could give any advice to new teachers, I would tell them to make sure that their desire to teach comes from the heart. Go the extra mile to help and to get to know students personally, because it is through love and respect that positive influence flourishes.

If I were to relive my life, I would choose the very same career—teaching.




Zack J. Weston (1924-2011), upon his return from military service the United States Navy during World War II , attended Lincoln University, Jefferson City, MO where he earned


