

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## 1. How do I apply and get accepted to Morris College?

Morris College procedures for applying and being accepted to the college instructions can be accessed by clicking on the links for New Students: **Clearance and Registration** and for Returning Students **Advising and Registration** on the onward and upward registration homepage on the website.

## 2. What is the cost to attend Morris College?

### REMOTE INSTRUCTION COSTS

Tuition \$6,710.00

Insurance Fee\* 597.00

TOTAL FALL SEMESTER \$7,307.00

All tuition charges and fee charges are assigned at the time of registration, and the only acceptable forms of payment for these charges shall be **cash, cashier check, certified check, money order, or major credit card.**

*\*Students who can provide Morris College with confirmation that they are already covered by an acceptable Health Insurance plan can elect to “Opt Out” of the Morris College plan and not pay the insurance fees.*

## 3. Do I have to reapply for financial aid every year?

Yes. Most financial aid offices require that you apply for financial aid every year. If your financial circumstances change, you may get more or less aid. After your first year, you will receive a “Renewal Application” which contains preprinted information from the previous year’s FAFSA. Note that your eligibility for financial aid may change significantly, especially if you have a different number of family members in college. Renewal of your financial aid package also depends on your making satisfactory academic progress toward a degree, such as earning a minimum number of credits and achieving a minimum GPA.

**4. How do I apply for a Pell Grant and other types of need-based aid?**

Submit a FAFSA. To indicate interest in student employment, student loans, and parent loans, you should check the appropriate boxes. Checking these boxes does not commit you to accept these types of aid. You will have the opportunity to accept or decline each part of your aid package later. Leaving these boxes unchecked will not increase the amount of grants you receive.

**5. Am I required to take a placement test?**

No, as a result of COVID-19, new incoming freshmen are not required to take the ACCUPLACER exam.

**6. When will I receive my fall course schedule?**

Freshmen will receive their fall schedules via email and postal mail. However also you can use your *Username* and *Password* to check your course schedule accessible through the Learning Management System (LMS).

**7. How do I access my classes remotely?**

Classes can be accessed, remotely through Morris College's Learning Management System (LMS). Your student username and password were emailed to you. **8. Who is my academic advisor and how can I contact him or her?**
