

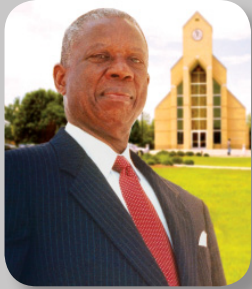

Clayton Speaks at Sophomore Assembly

Ms. Janet Clayton, director of the Learning Resource Center and 26 year employee of the college, spoke at the Sophomore Assembly on Thursday morning. Mrs. Clayton spoke on the theme, "Our Moment is Now: Promote the Positive Image"

Beginning with the quote, "We must know where we've been to know where we are going," Clayton shared the rich start of Historically Black Colleges and Universities, including the beginnings of Morris College.

She provided a gift of knowledge to the campus community when she shared that today, April 12, 2013 marks the 102nd anniversary of the college's incorporation. She said, "The college continues to be a family environment that nurtures students: a place of respect and pride." Clayton spoke of President Luns C. Richardson's dynamic leadership in the last 39 years and how it has transitioned the college to the strong quality accredited institution it is today.

She described the students of the past as "conservatively proper in their grammar, speech, and style and their behavior was secretly emulated by others." She asked, "What is the picture the world will see when you step out as Morris College students?"

Giving guidance for promoting a positive image, she advised knowing history, using it as a positive foundation to shape the future, and having self-respect and pride. She gave specifics for building intellectual power through research, reading, writing and engaging in the classroom. She also shared the value of having a positive attitude and looking up to positive role models. She charged students, "Free yourself from whatever holds you back for your moment is now."

President Richardson gave closing remarks, stating, "This is one of the best presentations that I've heard in this auditorium since my time here." He commended the officers and class advisors for selecting Ms. Clayton as their speaker. He encouraged students to participate in all that they can before the academic year comes to an end and to prioritize academics. He cautioned seniors to be academically ready for graduation. Dr. Richardson shared that two very important announcements pertaining to financial aid and an academic policy change will be made at the SGA Assembly on April 25.

Important News for Graduating Seniors

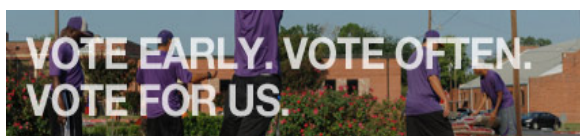

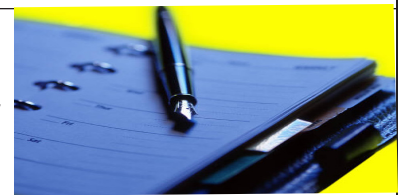
